In preparation of the 2020 maple sugaring season, the NHMPA will hold its annual meeting on Saturday, January 25th from 8:30am to 3pm at The Common Man Inn & Spa in Plymouth, NH.

Registration begins at 8:30 am and the meeting starts at 9am. Throughout the day, speakers will cover topics affecting the maple industry as well as those important to the continued growth and success of the NHMPA and its members. It will

- Contestants must bring their stored, qualified sample to the 2019 Winter meeting between 8:30-9am for final judging.

Anyone engaging in non-sportsmanship-like behavior may be disqualified.

The Annual IMSI/NAMSC Meetings

The joint-annual meeting of the International Maple Syrup Institute (IMSI) and the North American Maple Syrup Council (NAMSC) was held in Duluth, MN on October 21-24, 2020. The NHMPA delegate was David Kemp. This is a short synopsis of what has transpired this past year. The IMSI usually posts the meeting summaries on their website under News > Meeting Summaries. The complete meeting minutes for the NAMSC Annual meeting have been printed in the December issue of the Maple Digest.

IMSI Highlights

- How to Improve Syrup Quality An open discussion was held regarding the ongoing challenges with issues in the variations of maple syrup and the room for improvement. The impact of selling bad tasting syrup to consumers is unknown and the board resolved to take up the topic at the next board meeting.
- IMSI Grading School In 2018, the grading school was very popular with over 41 classes attended by 562 producers. The Centre's Acer extension also presented 77 conferences and courses to an estimated 6100 participants. Discussions regarding ways to expand the program and challenges surrounding the acceptable range of maple flavors were held.
- Regulatory updates The IMSI has retained the services of the Normandy Group in Washington, DC for monitoring and lobbying. The group will also inform the IMSI of pending regulations or activities that could present opportunities or pose a problem for the maple industry. It is hoped that the service will help the IMSI and its members stay informed and proactive.
- FDA added sugar label guidance Although the FDA has published non-binding guidance that the phrase "added sugar" will not be required on the nutrition facts label, there is still uncertainty about where and how the daily value percentage will be located and perceived by consumers. The IMSI are awaiting a response and will inform members of the outcome and recommended action.

NAMSC Highlights

- The Maple Research and Education Fund is open to member associations for grants of up to \$5,000 to support their educational projects designed to help maple producers make high-quality maple products.
- Updates to the Maple Manual are expected to be completed in late 2021. It is made possible by an ACER Grant supporting Dr. Timothy Perkins's work at the UVM Proctor Maple Research Center.
- Maple Digest supplements will be included through 2019-20. Topics to include Sugarbush Mapping, Hiring a Consultant Forester, and more.
- Off-flavored kits are being considered by the NAMSC Education Committee. The next kit may focus on chemical offflavors, such as defoamers and cleaning agents.
- Sugar house gray water regulations are increasing as gray water from cleaning ROs, tanks and pans are being considered as waste water.
- NAMSC Distinguished Service Award went to Avard and Jean Bentley of Westchester Station, Nova Scotia. The 2020 inductees into the Maple Hall of Fame are Joe Polak of Maple Hollow, Merrill, WI and Ray Bonenberg of Mapleside, Pembroke, ON.
